One out of every four dollars in U.S.-based mutual funds is invested in foreign securities, and last year, more than 90% of net inflows into U.S. stock mutual funds went into international funds. Global funds have grown at a 30% annual clip, far outpacing their U.S. counterparts. Hot markets, like China's, have more than doubled.
